Abrophyllum ornans Native Hydrangea

- Shrub or tree to 8M
- Fragrant green, white, cream or yellow flowers
- Purple or black berry fruit, 8-12mm long x 5-7mm wide, numerous seeds



Acacia flavascens

Yellow Wattle

- Tree to 20M, stems ribbed
- Fragrant pale yellow ball flowers
- Fruit is flat dehiscent pods, brown, 60-165mm long x 15-28mm wide
- Seeds eaten by Crimson Rosellas



Acacia mangium

Broadleaf Salwood/Blackwood

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Cream to white rod like flowers
- Dehiscent pods, pink to brown, 120mm long x 3-7mm wide, loosely or tightly coiled in clusters
- Seeds eaten by Red-cheeked Parrots



Acmena graveolens Cassowary Satinash

- Tree to 35M, buttressed, flying buttresses may be present
- White or cream fragrant flowers 2mm long
- Pink to pinkish-red berry fruit 50-60 mm diam.
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Adenanthera pavonina Red Bead Tree, False Red Sandalwood

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- 4mm cream or yellow flowers, 4-5 petals
- Dehiscent black-dark brown pod, twisted, 200-250mm long x 14-18mm wide. Several red seeds.
- Seeds used as decoration/jewellry



Adenia heterophylla

Lacewing Vine

- Vine, tendril climber to 30M
- Cream or pale yellow flowers, 10-30mm long
- Capsule fruit, ripening from green to orange to red, 40-130mm long x 30-35 wide




Agathis robusta

Queensland Kauri Pine

- Tree to 50M, up to 3M diameter
- Cone fruit, male cones 40-100mm x 7-9mm, female cones 90-150mm x 80-105mm. Winged seeds
- Fruit eaten by Sulphur-Crested Cockatoos





Aglaia sapindina Boodyarra

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- Green, white, cream or yellow fragrant flowers
- Orange berry fruit 15-28mm long x 15-21mm wide, sandpapery texture
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Wompoo Fruit-doves



Aleurites moluccana Candlenut/Indian Walnut

- Tree to 35M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant cream or white flowers
- Capsule fruit 40-45mm long x 40 60mm wide, 1-2 seeds 20mm long
- Seeds eaten by Musky-Rat Kangaroos
 & Native Rats

Alphitonia excelsa Sarsparilla Tree/Red Ash

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Greenish-white flower, unpleasantly scented
- Capsule fruit, green to black 5-10mm,
 1-3 orange-red seeds 7mm long
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Alphitonia petriei Sarsparilla Tree/Pink Ash

- Tree to 40M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers
- Black capsule fruit 7-8mm long x 7-15mm wide, 3 orange-red seeds 2-5mm long
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Alpinia caerulea

Native Ginger

- Shrubby plant 1-3M
- White, cream or pink flowers on a stalk rising above the end of the frond
- Berry fruit, turns blue as it ripens
- Underground rhizome



Alstonia muelleriana

Hard Milkwood

- Tree to 25M, pioneer species in disturbed rainforest
- Masses of white flowers, followed by long paired green pods, turning brown
- Fruits about 12-39cm long



Alstonia scholaris

Milky Pine

- Tree to 25M, pioneer species, may be buttressed
- Strongly perfumed white flowers, 5-10mm diameter
- Fruits about 15-32cm long with oblong seeds 4-5 x 0.9-1.2mm



Antirhea tenuiflora

Crimson Berry

- Shrub or tree to 20M, may be buttressed. Male and female plants
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers, tubular, 6mm long
- Pink to red drupe fruit 8-24mm long x
 5-19mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Doves, Cassowaries and King Parrots



Apodytes brachystylis

Buff Alder

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed. Male and female plants
- Green, white, cream or yellow flowers
 3-5mm long
- Green berry fruit with blue/black fleshy appendage, 12-15mm x 4-6mm
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Archidendron lucyi

Scarlett Bean

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white flowers 30-50mm long
- Fruit is a curved pod, red outside, orange inside, 70-120mm long x 15-25mm wide with several blue/black seeds



Archontophoenix alexandrae

Alexander Palm


- Tree, may be buttressed, to 40M (15-20M in cultivation)
- 10-12mm flowers, petals white or cream (Oct-Jun)
- Green/brown capsule/drupe fruit
- Seeds eaten by Torres Strait Pigeons



Arenga australasica

Bingil Bay Palm

- Multi stemmed palm to 20M, numerous suckers
- Cream flowers with red-brown markings, 3 petals, 10mm
- Red drupe fruit 15-20mm x 15-20mm
- Fruit eaten by Fruit Dove



Aristolochia tagala (acuminata)

Native Dutchman's Pipe

(Butterfly Plant)

- Climber, vigorous but non-invasive
- Purplish brown flowers, to 60mm
- Capsule fruit 35-62 x 25-30mm

Food plant of the Cairns Birdwing Butterfly



Arytera divaricata

Rose Tamarind

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white or yellow flowers, 4mm
- Orange, yellow or brown capsule fruit, 13-16mm long x 10-14mm wide, red aril almost/completely covering seed
- Aril eaten by Metallic Starlings



Atractocarpus fitzalanii Brown Gardenia, False Gardenia

- Tree to 20M. (6-7M in cultivation)
- White to cream flowers, 25-30mm
- Yellow, drupe fruit 60-100 x 50-90mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Barringtonia acutangula Red Flowering Barringtonia, Itchy Tree

- Freshwater mangrove tree to 25M, may be deciduous
- Long pink or red trailing flowers, petals 6-10mm long
- Fruit is a nut, green ripening to brown, becoming woody, 20-60mm long x 10-30mm wide



Barringtonia asiatica

Beach Barringtonia

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers with reddish/purplish edges 55-85mm long
- Large drupe fruit 85-110mm x 85-110mm



Barringtonia calyptrata

Mango Pine/Cassowary Pine

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed, deciduous.
- Masses of greenish yellow/white flowers 10-30mm long
- Blue-green drupe fruit smells like mangoes, 50-95mm long x 40-65mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Beilschmiedia obtusifolia

Walnut, Nutwood

- Tree to 35M, occasionally buttressed
- Unpleasantly scented green, white or yellow tepals 11-17mm long
- Black drupe fruit 18-24mm long x 11-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Fruit Doves, Pigeons, Starlings, Riflebirds, Figbirds, Bowerbirds and Spotted Catbirds



Bombax ceiba

Kapok Tree

- Tree to 25M, deciduous, may be buttressed
- Red, waxy flowers 60-90mm long, present when tree is leafless
- Brown or blackish woody capsule fruit, 80-120mm long x 20-45mm wide



Brachychiton acerifolius Illawarra Flame Tree/Flame Kurrajong

- Tree, deciduous to 45M (to 15M in cultivation)
- Sepals red/pink 10-30mm, Sept-Jan
- Black follicle fruit 80-120mm x 35-40mm
- Fruit eaten by King Parrots & Regent
 & Satin Bowerbirds



Breynia cernua Fart Tree

- Shrub to 5M, crushed leaves have very unpleasant odour
- Solitary flower 1-2mm petals absent, sepals are green, pink or red
- Pink, red or black berries 3-12mm long x 4-10mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Pigeons, Doves & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Buchanania arborescens

Jam Jam

- Tree to 25M, elongated leaves
- Small white or cream flowers 3-4mm long
- Drupe fruit, red to black, 9-12mm long x 10mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Fruit Doves, Metallic Starlings and Fawn-breasted Bowerbirds



Buckinghamia celsissima

Spotted Silky Oak

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers 7-10mm long
- Follicle fruit, green to brown/blackish 15-30mm long x 13-20mm wide
- Seeds eaten by Crimson Rosellas



Callistemon viminalis

Red Bottlebrush

- Shrub or tree to 15M, branches mostly weeping
- White, cream, pink or red flowers 4-6mm long
- Brown capsule fruit 5-6mm x 5-6mm, shed soon after ripening



Calophyllum inophyllum Beach Calophyllum

- Tree to 30M
- White or cream flowers with yellow centres, 9-16mm long
- Green to brown drupe fruit 25-50mm long (round)



Cananga odorata

Ylang Ylang

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Very fragrant yellow flowers, 50-90mm long
- Clusters of green to black berry or aggregate fruit 20-25mm long x 10-18mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Pigeons, Figbirds and Cassowaries



Canthium odoratum Shiny Leaved Canthium

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white or cream flowers,
 3mm long
- Black drupe fruit 5-6 x 5-6mm
- Fruit eaten by Fruit Doves and Lewin's Honeyeater



Carallia brachiata

Corkwood

- Tree to 30M
- Small green, white or cream flowers
- Orange, pink, red or black berries
- Fruit eaten by many birds including the Torresian Imperial Pigeon
- Host to the Peacock Jewel & Four
 O,Clock Moth & two butterflies



Cardwellia sublimis Northern Silky Oak/Bull Oak

- Primitive Plant. Tree to 35M
- White or cream spikes of fragrant flowers
- Large woody pods, 80-150mm, bearing 6-12 winged seeds
- Eaten by Bush Rats and Cockatoos



Castanospora alphandii

Brown Tamarind

- Tree to 45M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant flowers white to cream, 5 petals, about 2mm long
- Pink-brown or reddish berry 25-30mm long x 30-60mm wide, velvety & hairy
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Musky Rat-kangaroos



Castanospermum australe Black Bean, Moreton Bay Chestnut


- Tree to 35M. (8-10M in cultivation)
- Yellow to red flowers, 20-30mm July-Jan
- Dehiscent pod 90-250mm x 40-60mm Mar-Nov
- Seeds eaten by Sulphur Crested Cockatoos



Casuarina equisetifolia

Beach Sheoak

- Tree to 35M, branches weeping
- Male and female flowers
- Fruit brown and woody cone 10-24mm long x 9-13mm wide containing winged seeds
- Fruit eaten by Red-tailed Cockatoos



Cerbera floribunda

Cassowary Plum


- Tree to 30M. (To 10M in cultivation)
- White/cream flowers, pink centre
- Purple drupe fruit, 56-110mm x 40-65mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Palm Cockatoos



Chionanthus ramiflora

Native Olive

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white or cream flowers, 4 petals, 2-3mm long
- Drupe fruit, purple, blue or glaucous black 18-27mm long x 12-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Figbirds, Koels and Pied Imperial Pigeons



Clerodendrum tracyanum

Lolly Bush/Witches Tongues

- Shrub or tree to 10M
- White or cream flowers, 5 petals fused, 6-8mm long
- Green to black drupe fruit 4-7mm long
 x 6-7mm wide



Cochlospermum gillivraei

Kapok

- Shrub or tree to 10M, deciduous
- Yellow 5 petal flowers, may be red flecked,70-100mm diameter
- Brown woody capsule fruit 60-95mm long x 35-60mm wide. Numerous seeds attached to kapok/cotton-like fibre



Connarus conchocarpus

Conch Shell Vine

- Vine, twining
- Cream or yellow-brown flowers, 5-6mm long
- Red fruit 25-30mm long x 20mm wide




Cordyline cannifolia Palm Lily

- Shrub to 2M (rarely to 5M)
- Clusters of white, pink, cream or mauve flowers 6-8mm long
- Red berry fruits 10-14 x 10-14mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Cape York Rats and Fawn-footed Melomy



Cordyline manners-suttoniae Giant Palm Lily

- Shrub to 5M
- White or cream flowers, 7-12mm long
- Yellow to red berry fruits 8-15 x 8-15mm
- Fruit eaten by Figbirds



Corymbia ptychocarpa

Bloodwood

- Tree 8-15M
- Large bunches of red, pink, apricot or (rarely) white flowers, often in groups of seven
- Large, ribbed gumnuts follow flowering containing red/brown winged seeds



Crinum pedunculatum

River Lily

- Lily 2-3M
- Fragrant white or green flowers, 80-110mm
- Capsule fruit, similar to a small onion, white, green to cream, 30-50mm long x 25-50mm wide



Cryptocarya hypospodia White Laurel

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Unpleasantly scented white, cream or green flowers, 1-2mm long
- Black berry fruit, 13-18mm long x 12-17mm wide, slightly citrus scented
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Metallic Starlings, Pigeons, Fruit Doves & Figbirds



Cryptocarya laevigata Glossy Laurel

- Shrub or tree to 7M
- Green, white or cream flowers, may be scented, about 3mm long
- Fruit a nut disguised as a drupe, yellow, pinkish-yellow, pink, orange or red 17-33mm long x 17-38mm wide



Cryptocarya mackinnoniana

Rusty Laurel

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Unpleasantly scented green, white, cream or brown flowers, 2mm long
- Fruit nut disguised as a drupe, bluish-purple or black with palest brown spots. 19-28mm long x 13-17mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species and Native Rats



Cryptocarya oblata

Tarzali Silkwood

- Tree, buttressed to 35M (10M+ in cultivation)
- Green, white or cream flowers 2mm, sometimes fragrant, Nov-Feb
- Orange, pinkish orange or red nut, disguised as a drupe, 29-44mm x 32-53mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Musky Rat Kangaroos, Giant White-tailed, & Bush, Rats



Cupaniopsis anacardioides

Beach Tamarind/Tuckeroo

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- White, green, cream or yellowish 5petal flowers, unpleasantly scented
- Yellow or orange capsule fruit 15-30mm long x 15-22mm wide, velvet textured
- Fruit eaten by many bird species and Bush Rats



Cupaniopsis flagelliformis

Brown Tuckeroo

- Tree to 25M
- Pink, red, white or cream flowers, 5 petals 7-9mm diameter
- Yellow, orange or red capsule fruit 14-22mm long x 15-26mm wide



Cyathea cooperi Scaly Tree Fern/ Lacy Tree Fern

- Tree Fern up to 12M
- Thrives in full sun, vigorous grower
- Reproduces by shedding spores and also by rhizomes



Cynometra iripa Wrinkle-pod Mangrove

- Tree to 8M
- Pink or cream flowers, 5 petals, 1-2mm wide
- Brown, deeply wrinkled, indehiscent pod 25-48mm long x 20-40mm wide



Darlingia darlingiana

Brown Silky Oak

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Flower tepals 4, white or cream 25-30mm long, fragrant or unpleasantly scented

Leathery green to brown follicle fruit, 45-70mm long x 20-30mm wide, winged seed



Davidsonia pruriens

Davidson Plum

- Tree to 18M. (6-10M in cultivation)
- Flowers 3-5mm, petals missing, 4/5 sepals green or pink
- Purple, blue, black drupe fruit 18-27 x 12-15mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Sulphur Crested Cockatoos and Double Eyed Fig Parrots



Delarbrea michieana

Blue Nun

- Small tree to 8M
- Red or purple flowers, 5 petals about
 3mm long
- Drupe fruit, iridescent blue, 15-25mm long x 14mm wide
- Fruits eaten by Cassowaries, Bush Rats and used as decoration by Satin Bowerbirds



Dendrolobium umbellatum

Horse Bush

- Shrub or small tree to 8M
- White flower about 10mm long
- Fruit is a disarticulating pod, green to grey-brown, 8-50mm long x 4-6mm wide
- Readily browsed by cattle and horses



Deplanchea tetraphylla

Golden Bouquet Tree

- Tree to 20M
- Yellow flowers, 20-35mm long
- Brown capsule fruit 80-110mm long x 26mm wide
- Fallen flowers eaten by Wallabies



Dianella caerulea

Blue Flax Lily

- Lily to 2M, tufted
- Blue or purple flower, with green streaks, 6-11mm long
- Fruit is a blue or purple berry 7-14mm long x 8-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Regent & Satin
 Bowerbirds, Crimson Rosellas, King Parrots, Grey Shrike-thrushes & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Dictyoneura obtusa (microcarpa)

- Shrub or small tree to 13M, buttressed
- White, cream or yellow flowers, petals absent, 1-3mm long
- Yellow or orange capsule fruit, glabrous, 7-10mm long



Dillenia alata

Red Beech

- Tree to 15M
- Yellow flowers, 5 petals, about 80mm
- Pink or red capsule fruit, 40-55mm diameter, 6-8 valved
- Fruit eaten by Eclectus Parrots



Diospyros cupulosa

Brown Ebony

- Shrub or tree to 12M. Separate male and female plants
- White, cream or brown flowers, 6-8mm long
- Yellow, orange or red berry 10-27mm long x 12-16mm wide



Diploglottis diphyllostegia Northern Tamarind

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 4-5mm
- Yellow, orange or brownish capsule fruit, 10-17mm long x 15-28mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Orangefooted Scrubfowl, Metallic Starlings & Bush Rats



Diploglottis pedleyi Pedley's Tamarind

- Shrub or tree to 9M, often multi stemmed
- White or cream flowers 3-4mm long
- Green capsule fruit 35-60mm long x 40-80mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Diploglottis smithii

Smith's Tamarind

- Tree to 15M, buttressed
- White or cream flowers about 5mm
- Green or yellow capsule fruit, 15-45mm long x 20-55mm wide, velvety with white minute hairs



Dodonaea polyandra

Hop Bush

- Tree to 8M
- Flowers petals absent, 4-5 sepals, yellow or green
- Fruit is a 2 or 3 winged capsule or samara 16-28mm long x 15-30mm wide



Dysoxylum arborescens Mossman Mahogany

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- White, cream or greenish flowers 5-10mm long. Fragrant or unpleasantly scented
- Pink or pink-red capsule fruit 15-25mm long x 15-30mm wide



Dysoxylum gaudichaudianum Ivory Mahogany

- Tree to 36M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers 12-14mm long
- Capsule fruit, mustard yellow, brownish yellow or orange-brown,
 25mm long x 30-35mm wide. Velvet and hairy texture
- Seeds eaten by Metallic Starlings & Figbirds



Dysoxylum mollissimum Miva Mahogany

- Tree to 35M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant, 4 petals, white, cream or yellow flowers, 8-12mm long
- Brown, yellow-brown or orangebrown capsule fruit
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, seeds eaten by Metallic Starlings



Dysoxylum parasiticum

Yellow Mahogany

- Tree to 27M, may be buttressed
- White or cream, 3-4 petals, fragrant flowers 15-20mm long
- Brown or orange-brown capsule fruit
 20-40mm long x up to 40mm wide



Elaeocarpus bancroftii

Kuranda Quondong

- Tree to 30M, buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 15-23mm long
- Greenish-blue drupe fruit 40-55mm long x 33-40mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Spectacled Flying Foxes



Elaeocarpus grandis

Quandong

- Tree to 35M, buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers, about 5mm long
- Purple or blue drupe fruit, often with metallic shine, 15-33mm
- Fruit eaten by many bird species,
 Spectacled Flying Foxes, Musky Ratkangaroos & Bush Rats



Endiandra compressa Queensland Greenheart/Whitebark

- Tree to 20M, buttressed
- Fragrant white or yellow flowers, 12mm long
- Blue-black or black drupe fruit 45-71mm long x 39-60mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Endiandra globose

Ball-Fruited Walnut

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White or cream fragrant flowers, about 1-2mm long
- Black drupe fruit 34-60mm long x 33-60mm wide



Endiandra hypotephra Rose Walnut

- Tree to 30M, buttressed
- Pink, red or (rarely) pale green flowers, 3-6mm long
- Blue-black or black drupe fruitn20-28mm long x 12-16mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Fruit Pigeons



Endiandra impressicosta

Steelbutt

- Tree to 25M, buttressed
- Pink, red or green fragrant flowers about 4mm long
- Blue-black or black drupe fruit 45-60mm long x 30-37mm wide. Cut fruit is aromatic
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Pigeons, Doves, Metallic Starlings and Koels



Endiandra microneura

Noah's Walnut/Brown Walnut

- Tree to 30M, buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 1mm, fragrant
- Yellow or orange drupe fruit 50-78mm long x 28x43mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Endiandra montana Coach Walnut/Brown Walnut

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white or yellow flowers, 2-4mm long
- Yellow, orange or red drupe fruit,20 75mm long x 20-46mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, King Parrots, Pied Imperial Pigeons & Musky Rat-kangaroos



Endiandra sankeyana Sankey's Walnut

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White, yellow or brownish flowers, may be fragrant or unpleasantly scented
- Bleu-black or black drupe fruit 25-58mm long x 19-41mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Musky Rat-kangaroos and Bush Rats



Endiandra sideroxylon Steelbutt/Buff Walnut

- Tree to 35M, buttressed
- White, yellow or cream flowers, about 2mm long, may be fragrant
- Black drupe fruit, 36-57mm long x 20-29mm wide. Yellow flesh, smells like cologne when cut
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Spotted Catbirds, Figbirds, Superb Fruit Doves, Topknot Pigeons & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Endiandra wolfei

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Green, white or yellow flowers about
 2mm
- Blue-black or black drupe fruit, 20-24mm long x 10-13mm wide. Cut fruit is fragrant



Erythrina variegate

Coral Tree

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed, deciduous
- Red standard flower, 45-75mm long
- Fruit an indehiscent pod, brown to black, 70-300mm long x 20-25mm wide



Eugenia reinwardtiana

Beach Cherry

- Shrub or tree to 6M
- White or cream flowers, 4 petals about 3mm long
- Orange or red berry fruit 15-23mm long x 13-23mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Eupomatia laurina Bolwarra/Copper Laurel

- Shrub or small tree to 10M
- Fragrant white flowers 8-10mm long x 20-25mm diameter
- Dry, green to yellow or brown berry fruit, 24-40mm long x 15-45mm wide



Ficus benjamina Weeping Fig/Benjamin Fig

- Tree a banyan to 20M
- A strangler fig
- Fruits are small and shiny figs, 8-12mm, pink, red, purple or black when ripe

Flindersia bourjotiana Northern Silver Ash

- Tree to 35M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers 5-9mm long
- Green to brown capsule fruit 70-150mm long, 5 valved and spiny
- Seeds eaten by Sulphur-crested
 Cockatoos & Giant White-tailed Rats



Flindersia brayleyana

Queensland Maple

- Tree to 35M
- Fragrant white or cream flowers about 3mm long
- Green to brown capsule fruit, 60-100mm long



Flindersia ifflaiana

Cairns Hickory Ash

- Tree to 35M
- Fragrant white or cream flowers about 2mm long
- Brown to green capsule fruit 30-55mm long x 30-35mm wide, 5 valved and spiny



Flindersia pimenteliana Maple Silkwood, Rose Silkwood

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Flower petals 5, red or purple, 2-4mm
- Capsule fruit, green to brown, 55-115mm long, 5 valved & spiny.
- Seeds eaten by Sulphur-crested Cockatoos



Ganaphyllum falcatum Daintree Hickory

- Tree to 32M, may be buttressed
- Petal absent, 4-6 green, white or cream sepals 2-3mm
- Berry fruit ripening from yellow to orange to red, 10-15mm long x 6-13mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Garcinia warrenii

Native Mangosteen

- Tree to 15M
- Fragrant white or yellow male & female flowers, 4 petals, 9mm long
- Drupe fruit, yellow, red, purple or blackish 40-58mm long x 50-75mm wide



Glochidion ferdinandi

Ferdinand Buttonwood

- Shrub or tree to 15M
- Petals absent, 6 yellow sepals 2-3mm long
- Capsule fruit, green or white to palest pink or dark red, 6-8mm long x 10-20mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Glochidion harveyanum

Harvey's Buttonwood

- Shrub or tree to 12M
- Petals absent, 6 green, white or yellow sepals - 5mm diameter
- Capsule fruit, pink or white with a pink blush 8mm long x 12-18mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Gomphandra Australiana

Buff Beech

- Tree to 20M, separate male & female plants
- Green, white, cream or yellow flowers, 4-7 petals, 3mm long
- Orange to pink drupe fruit 20-25mm long x 12-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, pigeons, fruit doves, Metallic Starlings & Giant White-tailed Rats



Gmelina dalrympleana

Grey Teak

- Tree to 30M
- Fragrant cream, pink or purple flowers with yellow bases or spot on lowest petal
- Pink to red drupe fruit 14-20mm long x 10-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and fruit doves



Grevillea baileyana Findlay's Silky Oak

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers about 5mm long
- Brown follicle fruit 12-19mm long x 7-9mm wide



Harpullia frutescens Dwarf Harpullia

- Shrub to 2M
- Strongly scented white, cream or pinkish flowers, 5 petals, 17-20mm diam.
- Yellow, orange or reddish capsule fruit 12-16mm long x 20mm wide



Harpullia pendula Tulipwood

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Green, cream or yellow flowers, 5 petals, 5-12mm diam.
- Orange, yellow, red or pink capsule fruit 13-25mm long x 15-30mm wide
- Seeds eaten by Eclectus Parrots and King Parrots



Harpullia ramiflora

Cape York Tulipwood

- Tree to 9M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers, 4 or 5 petals, 10-13mm diam.
- Pink-red capsule fruit 12-18mm long x about 18mm wide



Heritiera littoralis Looking-glass Mangrove

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- Petals absent. Sepals 4 or 5, green outside, purple or red inside, 5-7mm long
- Woody, keeled, brown nut 50-100mm long x 30-60mm wide



Hernandia nymphaeifolia

Sea Hearse

- Tree to 18M, may be buttressed
- 6-8 tepals, white or cream about 5mm long and fragrant
- Black or dark brown nut 25-17mm
 long x about 20mm wide



Hibiscus tiliaceus

Cottonwood

- Tree to 12M
- White, cream or yellow flowers with a dark red base 40-80mm long
- Green to brown capsule fruit 15-28mm long x 15-22mm wide, densely hairy



Hicksbeachia pilosa

Red Bauple Nut

- Tree to 15M
- White, cream, pink, purple or red tepals 19-23mm long
- Orange or red drupe or fleshy follicle fruit 30-50mm long x 25-30mm wide



Homolanthus novo-guineensis Bleeding Heart

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Petals absent, male & female flowers, sepals 1-2mm diam. May be fragrant
- Green to purple capsule fruit 8-10mm
 x 8-10mm
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Hydriastele wendlandiana

Creek Palm

- Palm to 26M, clumping
- White, cream or yellow flowers, 3 petals, about 8mm diam.
- Orange or red drupe fruit 5-8mm x 5-8mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Metallic
 Starlings and Fruit Doves



Intsia bijuga

Kwila

- Tree to 30M
- White, ageing to pink or purple, single petal flower 12-33mm long, red stamens
- Green to brown, or blackish ,flat pod 85-280mm long x 40-80mm wide



Jagera pseudorhus

Foambark

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 5 petals, 4-6mm diam.
- Yellow, orange or brown capsule fruit, 14-20mm long x 12-18mm wide, covered in stiff hairs
- Seeds eaten by Regent & Satin
 Bowerbirds, Koels, Crested Shrike-tits
 & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Kleinhovia hospita

Guest Tree

- Tree to 8M
- Pink flowers, 5 petals, 5-6mm long
- Pink to cream or brown capsule fruit, inflated or bladdery, 5-valved, 12-20mm long x 15-25mm wide



Kopsia arborea Bingil Bay Tree

- Shrub or tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white or cream flowers, 5 petals, 15-32mm diam.
- Blue, maroon, purple or blackish berry fruit, 18-30mm long x 8-16mm wide, often in pairs



Lagerstroemia archeriana Native Crepe Myrtle

- Shrub or tree to 15M, deciduous
- Pink or purple flowers, 5-6 petals, 16 25mm long
- Brown or blackish capsule fruit 15-18mm long x 8-12mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Sulphur-crested Cockatoos



Larsenaikia ochreata Wenlock Gardenia

- Shrub or tree to 20M, deciduous, separate male and female plants
- Fragrant white, cream or yellow flowers, 5-6 petals, 17-40mm long
- Yellowish-green drupe fruit 22-50mm long x 15-35mm wide, minutely hairy



Leea indica

Bandicoot Berry

- Shrub to 4M. (3-4M in cultivation)
- Flowers 3mm green, white or yellow
- Red/purple or black berry, 8-11 x 5-15mm
- Fruit eaten by Wompoo Pigeon and other fruit doves



Lepidozamia hopei

Hopes Cycad

- Cycad to 18M
- Male cones 250-300mm long x 200mm wide, female cones slightly larger
- Female cones produce about 100 cream-brown seeds 40-62mm long x 25-40mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Native Rats



Licuala ramsayi Fan Palm

- Palm to 20M, solitary
- Unpleasantly scented cream flowers,
 3 petals, 2-3mm diam.
- Red or orange-red drupe fruit 9-11mm long x 8-10mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Litsea leefeana

Bollywood

- Tree to 30M, buttressed
- Fragrant green, white, cream or yellow tepals 1-3mm long
- Red ripening to black drupe fruit 12-23mm long x 10-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Lomandra hystrix Mat-Rush


- Herb to 1M, tufted
- Flower tepals 6, green, white, cream, yellow or pinkish, 3-5mm long.
- Capsule fruit. Green to white, cream, yellow or orange, 5mm long x 4-6mm wide



Lophostemon confertus

Queensland Box

- Tree to 40M
- White or cream flowers, 5 petals 6-9mm long. Flower diam. 20-25mm
- Green to brown capsule fruit 8-10mm long x 8-15mm wide, woody
- Fruit eaten by Red-tailed Black Cockatoos & Crimson Rosellas



Macaranga involucrate

Macaranga

- Large tree
- Fast growing pioneer species
- Prefer open sunny areas
- The male flowers are small and borne on thin branched peduncles
- female flowers are usually found in simple panicled spikes or racemes.
- Fruit is a green-yellow capsule splitting to reveal a black seed



Macaranga tanarius Blush Macaranga

- Shrub or small tree to 28M
- Green, white or cream flowers 1-3mm diam. within fringed bracts 4-12mm long, petals absent
- Green capsule fruit 6-13mm wide with rubbery appendages 10-12mm long
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Mackinlaya macrosciadea Blue Umbrella

- Shrub to 5M. (2-5M in cultivation)
- Green, white, cream or yellow flowers about 2.5mm
- Blue-grey or purple drupe fruit, 9-15 x 11-18mm

Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Catbird



Melaleuca leucadendra

Paperbark Tree

- Tree to 40M
- Fragrant cream or white flowers 7-25mm long
- Brown capsule fruit 3-6mm long x 4-7mm wide



Melastoma malabathricum

Native Lasiandra

- Shrub to 3M
- Pink, purple or white flowers, usually
 5 petals, 15-35mm long
- Capsule or berry fruit, ruptures when ripe, pink or red, 8-14 x 8-14mm, clothed in stiff bristles
- Fruit eaten by Bush Turkeys, Doubleeyed Fig Parrots & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Melia azedarach White Cedar/Persian Lilac

- Tree to 45M, deciduous, may be buttressed
- Blue, purple, white, cream or pink fragrant flowers, 6-10mm long
- Yellow or orange to brown drupe fruit 15-40mm long x 10-20mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Spectacled Flying Foxes
 & many bird species



Melicope bonwickii

Yellow Evodia

- Tree to 32M, may be buttressed
- Pink, or rarely white, flowers, 4-6mm
- Green to brown capsule or follicle fruit 4-6 x 4-6mm
- Seeds eaten by Sulphur-crested Cockatoos, Metallic Starlings, Lewin's Honeyeaters and Silver-eyes



Melicope elleryana

Evodia/Pink Euodia

- Tree to 35M, may be slightly buttressed
- Pink, purplish or dark red flowers, 5-7mm long
- Green to brown follicle or capsule fruit 5-13mm long, in clusters of 1-4
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Melicope rubra (Evodiella muelleri)

Little Evodia, Mueller's Evodia

- Shrub/tree to 10M. (6-8M in cultivation)
- 5-11mm pink to reddish purple flowers. Calyx white, cream or pink
- Green or yellowish capsule fruit, 35-30mm x 20-25mm
- Seeds eaten by Macleay's honeyeater.
 Food plant for Ulysses Butterfly



Melicope xanthoxyloides Euodia xanthoxyloides


- Shrub or tree to 21M, may have separate male and female plants
- Unpleasantly scented green, white, cream or yellow flowers, 2mm long
- Green to brown capsule fruit 3-5mm long
- Seeds eaten by Brown Cuckoo-doves
 & Black-faced Cuckoo Shrikes



Micromelum minutum

Lime Berry

- Shrub or small tree to 9M
- Fragrant green, white, cream or brown flowers about 3mm long
- Yellow to orange to red berry fruit 7-10mm long x 6-7mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Rose-crowned Fruit
 Doves & Wompoo Fruit Doves



Millettia pinnata

Pongamia

- Tree to 20M, deciduous
- Purple or pink flower with a green base, about 10mm long
- Woody brown indehiscent pod 55-95mm long x 20-30mm wide



Mischocarpus exangulatus Red Bell Mischocarp

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- Flower petals 5, green, white or cream, 2-3mm long
- Capsule fruit, orange-yellow to red, 18-40mm long x 10-15mm wide. Aril, yellow or orange, enclosing the seed



Molineria capitulata Weevil Lily

- Small plant to 1M, simple radiating leaves on stalks to 700mm
- Small yellow, indistinct flowers at ground level
- Hairy cream to brown berries containing numerous dark seeds



Morinda citrifolia Rotten Cheesefruit

- Tree to 12M. (3-10M in cultivation)
- White or cream flowers, 6mm
- Drupe or aggregated fruit. Green, white or cream, smells of rancid cheese
- Fruit/juice sold as Tahitian or Hawaiian Noni



Musa banksia

Native Banana

- Banana plant to 6M
- White, cream or yellow flowers 27-45mm long
- Yellow, erect, berry fruit 80-140mm long x 15-25mm wide



Musgravea heterophylla

Briar Silky Oak

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Cream or brown flowers 4-5mm long
- Follicle fruit, rusty, velvety & hairy, 70-95mm long x 25-36mm wide



Myristica insipida

Native Nutmeg

- Tree to 25M, separate male and female plants
- Cream or brownish tepals, 4-6mm long
- Brown capsule fruit, rusty & hairy, 25-40mm long x 15-30mm wide
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Nauclea orientalis

Leichhardt Bread Tree

- Tree to 30M, usually buttressed, deciduous or semi-deciduous
- Unpleasantly scented yellow flowers
- Brown drupe or aggregated fruit 40-50mm x 40-50mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Spectacled Flying-foxes



Neolitsea dealbata

Grey Bollywood

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- White, yellow or brown flowers, may be fragrant, 2-6mm long
- Red to black drupe fruit 8-11mm x 8-11mm
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Normanbya normanbyi

Black Palm

- Palm to 30M, solitary
- White or pink flowers, 15-20mm diameter
- Red or pinkish drupe fruit 30-50mm long
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Sulphurcrested Cockatoos



Orthosiphon aristatus

Cat's Whiskers

- Herb to 1M
- Pink, white or pale purple flowers about 12mm diameter
- Fruit is a nut about 2mm long, enclosed in a boat-shaped calyx



Palaquium galactoxylon Cairns Pencil Cedar

- Tree to 30M, buttressed, deciduous
- Green flower, 6 petals, about 6mm long
- White or cream drupe fruit 30-40mm long x 12-30mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Fruit Doves



Pandanus lauterbachii

Swamp Pandanus

- Pandanus tree to 20M, spiny conical nodules on trunk, suckers at base
- Multiple orange fruit 60-200mm long x 35-120mm wide, segments spine tipped
- Fruit eaten by Magnificent Riflebirds



Pandanus monticola Urchin-fruited Pandan

- Pandanus shrub or tree to 10M, trunk more slender than other species
- Multiple red fruit 60-120mm long x 55-120mm wide, numerous segments, spine tipped
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Giant White-tailed Rats



Pandanus tectorius

Beach Pandanus

- Pandanus tree to 12M, spiny conical nodules on trunk
- Yellow or orange multiple fruit 120-180mm long x 100-130mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Palm Cockatoos



Pararchidendron pruinosum

Snow-wood

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant green, white or yellow flowers
- Orange to brown or blackish coiled dehiscent pod, orange to reddish inside, 80-120mm long x 10-20mm wide



Parinari nonda

Nonda Plum

- Tree to 12M
- White, cream, yellow or brown flowers
- Yellow, orange or brown drupe fruit, 30-40mm long x 25-35mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries,
 Spectacled Flying Foxes & several bird species



Phaleria clerodendron Scented Daphne, Rosy Apple

- Tree, may be buttressed, to 10M (6-8M in cultivation)
- 25-45mm white or cream sepals. Very strongly scented.
- Red, drupe fruit 20-40mm x 35-55mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Phyllanthus cuscutiflorus Phyllanthus

- Shrub or small tree to 10M
- Unpleasantly scented green, white or pink flowers
- Green to brown capsule fruit about
 3mm long x 4-5mm wide



Pittosporum ferrugineum

Rusty Pittosporum

- Shrub or tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white, cream or yellow flowers
- Yellow or orange to blackish capsule fruit 10-18mm long x 7-15mm wide
- Seeds eaten by Metallic Starlings



Pittosporum rubiginosum Hairy Red Pittosporum

- Shrub to 2M, rarely to 6M
- White, cream or yellow flowers, may be fragrant, 14-16mm long
- Yellow or orange capsule fruit 13-23mm long x 6-20mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Giant White-tailed Rats & Bush Rats



Pleiogynium timorense Burdekin Plum

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed, separate male & female plants
- Green, white, yellow or brown flowers about 3mm long
- Reddish, purple or black drupe fruit
 20-28mm x 20-28mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Great Bowerbirds



Pleomele angustifolia

Native Dracaena

- Shrub or tree to 8M
- Fragrant green, white, cream or yellow flowers, 3 petals, 15-33mm long
- Orange to red berry fruit 10-16mm long x 10-15mm wide



Podocarpus dispermus

Brown Pine

- Tree to 20M
- Male cones 40-50mm long x 3mm wide
- Green drupe-like fruit 17-22mm long x 12-19mm wide, attached to a fleshy red receptacle
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Musky Rat-kangaroos



Podocarpus grayae

Northern Brown Pine

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Male cones 20-60mm long x 3-5mm wide
- Green drupe-like fruit, red receptacle
- Fruit eaten by pigeons and Cassowaries



Polyalthia michaelii

Canary Beech

- Tree to 25M
- Green, white, cream or yellow flowers about 25mm long, may be fragrant
- Orange berry or aggregate fruit 30-58mm long x 30-50mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Spectacled Flying Foxes



Polyscias australiana

Ivory Basswood

- Shrub or tree to 15M
- White or cream flowers, 5 petals, 1-3mm long
- Purple to black drupe fruit 5-10mm long x 5-9mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Polyscias nodosa

- Tree to 20M
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers, 5 petals, about 2mm long
- Red to black drupe fruit 5-7mm diameter, occurs in umbels



Pouteria chartacea Thin-leaved Coondoo, Dugulla

- Tree to 12M, may be buttressed
- Green, white or cream flowers, 5 petals, about 3mm diameter
- Red to black drupe fruit 15-22mm long x 5-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Proiphys amboinensis Cardwell Lily

- Lily to 1M, deciduous
- Fragrant white flower 25-40mm long
- Green to blackish capsule fruit 25-30mm long x 15-45mm wide



Ptychosperma elegans

Solitaire Palm

- Palm to 15M, solitary
- Fragrant green, white or cream flowers
- Red drupe fruit 12-20mm long x 8-13mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Pied Imperial-pigeons, Fruit Doves, Lewin's Honeyeaters, & Eclectus Parrots



Ptychosperma macarthurii

MacArthur Palm

- Palm to 9M, mostly clumping
- Green, white or cream flowers
- Orange to red drupe 15-20mm long
- Fruit eaten by Eclectus Parrots and pigeons



Rauwenhoffia (Melodorum) leichhardtii

Zig Zag Vine

- Shrub or vine, branch-tendril climber ho
- Unpleasantly scented white, cream, yellow or orange-brown flowers
- Yellow to orange berry or aggregate fruit 11-45mm long x 8-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & many bird species



Rhodomyrtus trineura

Rusty Ironwood

- Tree or shrub to 6M
- White, cream or pink flowers
- Cream, pink or brown berry fruit 10-13mm x 10-13mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries, Blackfaced Cuckoo Shrikes & Brown Cuckoo-doves



Rhus taitensis

Sumac

- Tree to 30M, buttressed
- White or cream 5 petal flowers, about 2mm long
- Drupe fruit ripening from yellow to black, 6-8 x 4-8mm
- Fruit eaten by Metallic Starlings



Rhysotoechia robertsonii

Robert's Tuckeroo

- Tree to 16M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers 5-7mm
- Yellow or orange capsule fruit often with red blush, glabrous, 16-28mm long x 22-35mm wide, 3 valved
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Sarcotoechia serrata

Fern Leaved Tamarind

- Tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- White, cream or yellow flowers, 3-4mm diam.
- Yellow or orange capsule fruit, 12-23mm long x 12-25mm wide, minutely hairy



Scaevola taccada

Sea Lettuce Tree

- Shrub to 4M
- White or cream flowers often with purple veins
- White drupe fruit 7-18mm long x 7-16mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries and Silvereyes



Schefflera actinophylla Umbrella Tree

- Shrub or tree to 24M, often epiphytic
- Flowers may be fragrant, pink or red on the outside, white or cream inside
- Dark red to black berry fruits 6-8mm, in clusters 20-25mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species and Musky Rat-kangaroos, Red-legged
 Pademelons & Spectacled Flying
 Foxes



Schefflera bractescens Schefflera versteegii Pascoe Umbrella

- Shrub to 4M, often or an epiphyite or lithophyte
- Green, white or cream tepals 2-3mm
- White, cream or black berry fruit 4-5mm



Scolopia braunii

Brown Birch

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white, cream or yellow flowers about 3mm long
- Drupe fruit ripening from yellow to red to purple or black, 11-13mm
- Fruit eaten by Lewin's Honeyeaters, & many other bird species



Sophora tomentose

Silver Bush

- Shrub to 5M
- Yellow flower, may be slightly fragrant, 1bout 15mm long
- Brown or grey indehiscent pod 60-200mm long x 6-10mm wide



Sterculia quadrifida

Peanut Tree

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed, deciduous
- Flower petals absent. Sepals 4-5 green, white, cream, pink, orange or brown
- Orange or red follicle fruit 35-80mm long x 18-50mm wide, velvety, usually in clusters



Synoum glandulosum

Northern Scentless Rosewood

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- White, cream or pink flowers about 5mm, fragrant
- White, cream, yellow or brown capsule fruit 12-20mm long x 12-27mm wide
- Seeds eaten by many bird species



Syzygium alliiligneum Onionwood, Mission Beach Satinash

- Tree, buttressed to 35M (10M+ in cultivation)
- Green, white or cream 4 petal flowers
 16mm. Fragrant. Feb-Apr
- Fruit pink or red berry, 30-40mm x 30-43mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Syzygium australe Creek Satinash, Creek Cherrry

- Shrub or tree to 24M. (3-10M in cultivation)
- 3-6mm white or cream flowers
- Pink or red, (rarely purple) berries 14-23 x 8-17mm
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Syzygium canicortex

Yellow Satinash

- Tree to 35M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 2mm
- Red berry fruit 6-12 x 6-12mm, squashed fruit smells similar to apples



Syzygium cascade (variable) (Syzygium Wilsonii <u>X</u> Syzygium Leuhmannii)

Lillypilly (variety)

- Shrub to 3M
- White, pink or red flowers
- Small white berry fruit

Syzygium cormiflorum Bumpy Satinash

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- Green, white, cream or pink flowers, 8-15mm
- White, cream, pink or reddish-pink berry fruit 30-70mm x 30-70mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Syzygium divaricatum

Smaller Cassowary Satinash

- Tree to 30M, usually buttressed
- White, cream or pink fragrant flowers
 1-2mm long
- Leathery pink or reddish berry 50-60mm long and wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Syzygium erythrocalyx Johnstone River Apple

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Cream or pinkish flowers about 12mm long
- Red berry fruit 40-80mm long x 35-70mm wide
- Fruit eaten by King Parrots & Giant White-tailed Rats



Syzygium fibrosum

Fibrous Satinash

- Shrub or tree to 15M, may be buttressed
- White, cream or brown flowers 6-7mm long
- Pink or red berry fruit 10-16mm long x 18-21mm wide



Syzygium forte White Apple

- Tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers about 6mm
- White or cream berry fruit 30-47mm long x 30-43mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Spectacled Flying Foxes



Syzygium graveolens

Cassowary Satinash

- Tree to 35M, buttressed
- Fragrant white or cream flowers, about 2mm long
- Leathery pink or reddish berry 50-60mm long and wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Syzygium gustavioides Watergum/Grey Satinash

- Tree to 40M, buttressed, often with some flying buttresses
- Fragrant white or cream flowers 3-4mm
- Green, dry berry fruit with purplish or brown patches 60-90mm diam
- Fruit eaten by Musky Rat-kangaroos, Bush Rats & Giant White-tailed Rats



Syzygium hemilampra

Blush Satinash/Broad-leaved Lilly Pilly

- Shrub or tree to 30M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 1-2mm long
- White or cream berry 11-22mm long and wide
- Fruit eaten by pigeons



Syzygium johnsonii Johnson's Satinash

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed or silt-rooted
- White or cream flowers
- Purple berry fruit 20mm long x 15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by pigeons, Spotted Catbirds & Cassowaries



Syzygium Kuranda Cherry Satinash

- Tree to 35M, may be buttressed
- Fragrant white, cream or pink flowers
- Cream, orange-brown or pinkishbrown dry berry fruit 35-40mm long x 40-45mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Musky Rat-kangaroos, Sulphur-crested Cockatoos, Figbirds, King Parrots & Cassowaries



Syzygium luehmannii

Cherry Satinash/Small-leaved Lilly Pilly

- Tree to 35M, buttressed
- Fragrant white or cream flowers
- Pink, purplish or red berry fruit 7-11mm x 7-11mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries & Metallic
 Starlings



Syzygium malaccense Pink Satinash/Malay Apple

- Tree to 25M, mostly buttressed
- White, cream, pink or purplish flowers
- Red to blackish berry fruit 18-22mm long x 18-28mm wide



Syzygium tierneyanum

River Cherry

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers
- White, cream, pink or red berry fruit 15-20mm x 15-20mm
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Syzygium wilsonii

Powder Puff Lilly Pilly, Wilson's Satinash

- Shrub/tree to 6M. (2-6+M in cultivation)
- 3mm flowers. White, cream, pink or red
- White or cream berry, 10-18 x 10-16mm
- Attracts many bird species



Tabernaemontana pandacaqui Banana Bush

- Shrub to 4M
- Fragrant white flower, 5 petals 18-30mm diam.
- Orange follicle fruit, glabrous or hairy, 20-50mm long x 6-1mm wide, usually in pairs



Tapeinochilos ananassae

Back-scratcher Ginger

- Herb (ginger-lily) to 4M
- Yellow, 3 petal flowers on red calyx or bracts
- Red berry or capsule fruit with a white base ripening to brown, 30-35mm long



Terminalia arenicola Brown Damson

- Tree to 11M, deciduous, may be buttressed
- Flower petals absent, 5 sepals white or cream, unpleasantly scented
- Red to purple or black drupe fruit 25-40mm long x 17-25mm wide
- Fruit eaten by Cassowaries



Terminalia catappa Sea Almond, Indian or Tropical Almond

- Tree, deciduous, may be buttressed, to 16M+ (8-20M in cultivation)
- White, cream or yellow sepals 5-13mm, Oct-May
- Yellowish to pink, red then purplish drupe fruit, 50-80 x 25-50mm
- Edible fruit. Fruit eaten by Cockatoos, Cassowaries & Flying Foxes



Terminalia muelleri

Mueller's Damson

- Tree to 18M, deciduous, may be buttressed
- Flower petals absent, white or cream sepals
- Blue, purple or black drupe fruit 12-20mm long x 8-15mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species



Terminalia sericocarpa

Sovereignwood/Damson Plum

- Tree to 40M, deciduous, may be buttressed
- Flower petals absent, cream, white, green or yellow sepals, unpleasantly scented
- Pink, red, blue or purple drupe fruit glabrous or hairy, 13-18mm long x 8-10mm wide
- Fruit eaten by many bird species & Spectacled Flying-foxes & Cuscus



Ternstroemia cherryi

Cherry Beech

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- White, cream or yellow flowers 5-12mm long
- An orange capsule fruit 25-50mm long x 25-35mm wide
- Fruit eaten by fruit-doves, possums, native rats & Metallic Starlings



Tetrasynandra longipes Tetra Beech

- Shrub or small tree to 15M, can have separate male & female plants
- Fragrant yellow or orange flowers 1.5-4mm
- Bluish or black drupe fruit 15-20mm long x 10-14mm wide



Thespesia populnea Northern Cottonwood

- Shrub or tree to 10M
- Yellow flowers, 5 petals, with dark red or purplish bases, old flowers becoming completely red
- Fruit is a many seeded green to brown nut, 20-33mm long x 25-45mm wide, dotted with rusty scales



Timonius timon

- Tree to 20M, separate male & female plants
- Fragrant white or cream flowers 3-5mm long, 4-10 petals
- Green to brown berry fruit 9-20mm long x 8-20mm wide, sparsely hairy



Toechima erythrocarpum Pink Toechima/Pink Tamarind

- Tree to 20M, may be buttressed
- White or cream flowers, 6-7mm
- Orange, yellow, pink or red capsule fruit 20-35mm long x 15-39mm wide
- Seeds eaten by Victoria's Riflebirds, King Parrots & Lewin's Honeyeaters



Toona ciliata

Red Cedar

- Tree to 45m, may be buttressed, deciduous
- Fragrant white or cream flowers 3-6mm long
- Brown capsule fruit 10-22mm long x
 6-12mm wide, slightly woody



Viola hederacea

Native Violet, Ivy-leaved Violet

- Herb to 120mm, perennial
- Flower petals 5, white or pale purple with dark purple blotches, 7-10 mm long. May be fragrant
- Capsule fruit 4-6mm long



Wodyetia bifurcata

Foxtail Palm

- Palm to 15M, solitary
- Green or yellow-green flowers 25-30mm diam.
- Orange to red drupe fruit 47-65mm x
 27-53mm
- Fruit eaten by Giant White-tailed Rats
 & feral pigs



Xanthostemon chrysanthus

Golden Penda

- Tree to 25M, may be buttressed
- Cream, yellow or greenish flowers
- Green to brown, woody, capsule fruit about 10-14mm x 10-14mm



Xanthorrhoea johnsonii

Grass Tree

- Grass tree to 4M
- White flowers opening progressively up the spike
- Trunks grow 1M per 100 years, flower spike can grow 30mm in a day
- Well adapted to fire
- Found only in Australia
